THE CLUB LAYOUTS

Waterstock . . .

We have started getting this layout ready for the Warley show which seems a long way off but which will come quickly upon us as we only meet twice a month. Mike Turner has completely rebuilt the lighting units making them able to be taken apart into smaller sizes for easing transportation. At the same time he has changed our lights and fittings as we cannot get the old type any more – something to do with EU regulations. Vince Painter has found plastic edging enabling us to protect the top of the back scenes and the group is involved in sorting out any details such as paintwork which needs touching up. In May we completely dismantled the layout and prepared it for transport, taking it downstairs as if going to an exhibition, where it was rebuilt and everything checked again before dismantling and rebuilding again upstairs. We need to do this because it has remained in situ for many years and some members have never seen it apart. Better we find any faults at our church hall rather than when the layout reaches the Warley show. Actually it all came apart very well, and members put it all together again and had trains running within an hour of carrying it all downstairs. Edgar Mason has flame retarded the long layout curtains using his garden spray. We are now making a list of what to do and a separate list of what to take to Warley, in terms of things like soldering iron, spare hand controller etc. The church has provided us with a white board and Tony Minchin has fixed that and a pin notice board to the walls of the layout room.

Tipton Hills...

This does look good following modifications learnt from exhibitions last year and everyone worked to get things in place for the AMRTM exhibition. One of the curves through the hills has been widened to give a better radius, the caravan park has been completed, and the outer rail can now be used continually including the fiddle board to run longer trains. Dave Evans has fitted Perspex to the front to avoid straying fingers and his wife has made a curtain for us to hide its legs and lower framework. Rodney Hodge has painted all the visible baseboard paintwork matt black and Edgar Mason has sprayed the curtain with flame resistant chemicals. Dave Evans has also built a wooden literature box for the layout to hold our layout information which we give out at exhibitions. It is being prepared for Super Sunday.

Whartson Hall...

Mike Turner and the transverser seem to be fighting each other, but then again it's the biggest transverser many of us have seen so moving that in and out plus lining up the tracks was never going to be easy. The principle is a great idea, Mike has plenty of other ideas, but practical implementation of ideas often takes longer.

It was becoming apparent that I needed to make more use of the space I had available!

The idea of extending into an 'L' shape came to light – Drawings done on AnyRail and coloured to indicate sections



Emmerdale on TV took a back seat whilst my design work advanced!

The 4'x1' baseboard for the extension into sisings and a Metcalfe engine shed were constructed.



Space, Time and a Plan

Things are coming on, track laying, testing and plans for scenery now in full swing. Distractions in my life are now reducing in number and I can concentrate on what's important for me and my immediate family. Two or three nights a week was my aim through the summer of 2013, but due to high temperatures in July and August I ended up doing overtime at work. So, lots of jobs on the back burner, attendance at WMNGC almost non existant. 3

Frustration set in, and I found myself building kits for the layout sat in front of the TV – at least I was in the *same room* as her indoors! No running time for a while.

Soon, thoughts turned to scenery. My idea originally to model Bloxwich from All Saints Church, past the old open market and police station down the cobbled road to the Station Hotel, and on to the Station car park was still in place.



The more ambitious idea of running a road from the church to the bridge and over into Croxtalls Road and what is now central drive on the Dudley fields, had been shelved.

Track Laying and Testing



Track at the baseboard join was achieved by using a large stapler, one of the tips I had picked up at the WMNGC one Saturday when I could make it!



It was meant to be a temporary measure, prior to permanent fixing by soldering the track to copper clad board method – it remains in place to date, hidden under my removable scenic hill. However I have



not separated the two boards since – watch this space.

I decided that operating space at the rear of the layout was important as I needed an area for my isolating switches, not wishing to develop a control panel at this stage.



This prompted me to separate the viewable area from the operating area on a permanent basis.



This has given me a lot of scope for incorporating retaining walls and scenic backgrounds along four edges of the 'L' shape. The open ends of the 'L' allow for extensions to eventually join up into an oblong, with continuous running – in my dreams.



Rest time now. The home made dust covers are on.

Super Sunday for N Gauge modellers

N-gauge modellers have a Super-Sunday in which to celebrate their passion, when **Wonderful World of Trains & Planes** joins forces with the **West Midlands N Gauge Club** to host a special day dedicated to N gauge layouts.

Almost 30 layouts will be running on the day, Sunday 19th October, from 10am to 5pm, with several UK-themed layouts, as well as some depicting Germany, France and the USA.

The modellers of each layout will be on hand to operate and discuss, but this is a unique opportunity to get all these N gauge layouts together which enthusiasts and casual visitors will not want to miss.

Other modellers with N (or smaller) gauge layouts are also welcome to contact the show if they would like to join in. Just get in touch.

Visitors on the day also have full access to the three floors of layouts at WWTP, a permanent venue that opened in June just off St Paul's Square in Birmingham. These include layouts featuring Canada, France, Germany and UK, together with others in the construction stage. Other layouts and presentations feature the Royal Train and the Orient Express.

Professional flight simulators and a four-car race track are also part of the overall experience. There is also a coffee shop and retail store.

Wonderful World of Trains & Planes is the country's newest and brightest model venue - a wonderful experience for all the family.

The West Midlands N Gauge Club was formed in 1995. It was an area group of the N Gauge Society and is based in Tipton with members from all over the W Midlands. It meets in the afternoons of the 1st and 3rd Saturdays of each month. It has a 20ft exhibition layout named "Waterstock," a 6 ft exhibition layout named "Tipton Hills," and a layout under construction based on Water Orton and named "Whartson Hall."
